

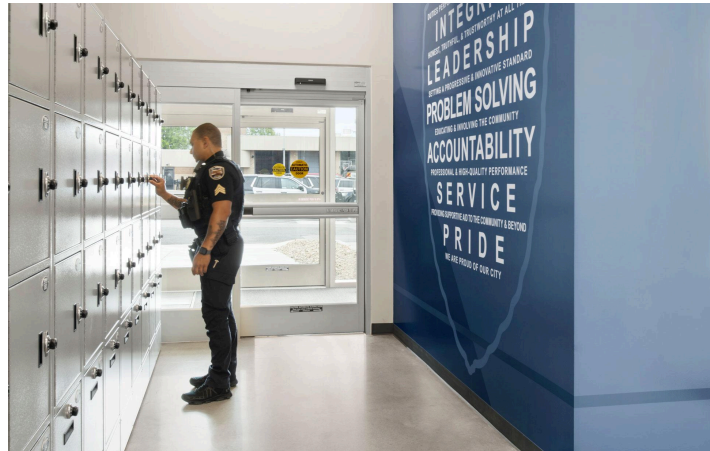

Raymore Police are receiving increased reports of unsafe usage of e-bikes, e-scooters and golf carts. In Missouri, e-bikes, e-scooters, golf carts and other vehicles designated as Neighborhood Vehicles are illegal to operate on public streets unless the driver holds a valid driver's license. Motorized vehicles are not allowed in Raymore parks or on park trails. Raymore Police will be enforcing speed limits, registration requirements and age restrictions for these vehicles and encourage parents to supervise their children and set rules for safety when on motorized bikes and scooters.
